

SHELTER-IN-PLACE KIT

Each kit includes duct tape, masking tape, a bottled water, towel, first-aid kit, crank radio/flashlight and emergency contact information in a large poly bag. An all-hazards radio is provided to schools and public facilities for early warning of chemical incidents or hazardous weather conditions.


SHELTER IN PLACE PREPLANNING STEPS

1.



NOAA RADIO: Listen to the radio for instructions from emergency management or weather officials. (Batteries included)

2.



If you are instructed to Shelter-In Place, go to your designated area as shown on the Diagram to secure your area.

<u>MASKING TAPE</u>: Is used to cover windows to prevent shattering glass.

DUCT TAPE: Is used to tightly seal around doors and windows:

<u>RADIO/FLASHLIGHT</u>: Hand crank combination radio-flashlight to get safety messages and communcations.

4.



<u>TOWELS:</u> Place (dampened) towel under door to create a barrier between you and potentially hazardous air outside.

5.



<u>BOTTLED WATER</u>: Use to dampened towels for emergencies. (Bottled water can be used even if expired for this purpose only).

6.



<u>FIRST-AID KITS</u>: First Aid kit supplies to use during minor accidents, emergencies, or disaster situations.
